Instructions for authors

Submission of articles

Articles should be submitted to:

Although exceptions may be considered, articles should not exceed 5,000 words. Each essay should be accompanied by a bilingual abstract. The latter must be in English and in the language of the text. If the article is written in English, the second language may be one of those allowed by the journal.

Authors should indicate their contact (especially e-mail) upon their submission. A cover letter (e-mail) is recommended. All articles are preliminarily examined by the Editorial Board and then forwarded to the qualified referee panel for the reviewing process.

Authors retain their right to use their work for private or public educational purposes (presentations, classes, research, etc.).

Preferred Format

Articles should be submitted in electronic form, preferably via e-mail as a MS Word file for Windows. Figures and tables are treated as text and should be: 1) appended to the text of the article; 2) submitted as separate files. Phonetic marks should be clear and distinct. Any specific details about a specific font or characters requiring explanation should be noted in the cover letter (e-mail).

Footnotes

Footnotes are recommended for additional comments and information.

Text references

Harvard-style references are preferred and should follow the following format:

(Wedgwood 1989a: 124-175)

Please note:

- a) use of the colon,
- b) full page numbers (not 124-75),
